## **WORKSHOP DESCRIPTION**

As part of the exchange agreement between EHESS and JHU, members of the Hard Histories at Hopkins laboratory invite French colleagues to join them in comparing the historical approaches to "hard histories" taken by their respective research centers. They wish to extend the analysis to examine how these pasts persist in the present, and how their study helps to imagine a fairer future. By sharing current research while considering the diversity of conceptions of history and memory in France and the United States, this workshop will aim comparatively to elucidate what, in historical research, leads to self-examination, the destruction of myths and the breaking of silences. Finally, it will ask how this work can serve the communities it addresses.
